Maryland Historical Trust Announces Workshops to Discuss Historic Preservation Capital Grants

Program to Fund \$600,000 in Preservation Projects in FY20

CROWNSVILLE, MD – The Maryland Historical Trust (MHT) today announced several upcoming workshops in November to provide guidance on applying for \$600,000 in grant funding for historic preservation projects through its Capital Grant Program. The goal of the program is to promote the preservation of properties that are listed or are eligible for listing on the Maryland Register, either individually or as a contributing structure. Grants up to \$100,000 are available for acquisition, restoration, and rehabilitation projects of eligible properties. Predevelopment costs can also be funded for some projects.

Several workshops will be held in November and applications will be available on the MHT grant webpage, <u>mht.maryland.gov/grants.shtml</u>, beginning Monday, February 10, 2020 through Monday, March 23, 2020. The application must be submitted through the Maryland Historical Trust's online grant application portal. Guidelines, eligibility information, workshop details, and the link to the online portal will be available in early November at the Maryland Historical Trust's website: <u>mht.maryland.gov/grants_capital.shtml</u>.
